Dear friends and partners with us ...

In the autumn of 2006, we launched our exclusive **NEXGEN** imprint which would identify projects for upcoming generations. Generally speaking, this would target children and young people for educational, emotional & personal needs.

**NEXGEN ZAMBIA 1 PHASE 1** project was for the construction of a dormitory block to house vulnerable young teenage girls. We are working in partnership with friends in Longezia, Sinazongwe on the shores of Lake Kariba. After much searching and thought, land & educational facilities were found in Lusaka, capital city of Zambia.



**October 2007** saw us send £3000 for the construction costs, the building was completed earlier this year.

We are so pleased to be able to update you and tell you that 5 girls commenced their education on 11<sup>th</sup> May this year. They are attending a private school – Knox International which is on the same land as the dormitory. They will receive a high standard of education and were hand picked so that the right students with the most potential to cope with this standard, were chosen.....here they are!

Name – Margaret Mwanda  
**Vulnerable status**

Goal – Accountant, she would love to work in a banking institution



Three of these girls have lost their fathers (single orphans), Bertha, a very bright girl, has lost both parents and Margaret is from a severely impoverished family and so is classed as 'vulnerable'. Their homes are in Sinazongwe about 4 hours from Lusaka and will go home after each term. In mid July, the school will be at their annual conference and we understand the girls have submitted some of their work!  
In our next update, we hope to have some more pictures and information of how they have settled in.



NEXGEN ZAMBIA 1 PHASE 2 has raised some finance for the ongoing expenses of each girl including tuition, boarding, transport (home & back), meals.
